ELIGIBILITY

A Bethany Baptist Church High School Graduate in good standing and active in church and/or youth ministry. All candidates must be planning to pursue post-secondary education.

CRITERIA

- Each candidate will write a **500–750-word essay** responding to ONE of the following prompts. Please be sure to state which prompt you will be responding to on the application.
 1. Describe an experience in your life that challenged you to demonstrate leadership and overcome obstacles in your community, school, social life or family life.
 2. Explain what you think our community can do to foster unity.
 3. Explain the importance of growing organic and treating the environment well.
 4. Explain what it means to be a good student in the community, on the field, and in the classroom. Explain how you exemplified this.
 5. Explain the importance of higher education in the life of today’s Christian leaders.
- Three letters of recommendation (No relatives, must be school, church, or community)
 - Official/Unofficial transcript
 - Resume
 - Complete scholarship application

APPLICATION PROCESS

COMPLETED applications must be submitted to youthrevolution@experiencebethany.com by June 5, 2026. Complete applications include all requested materials, and a complete application. Interviews for candidates will be notified.

Selected recipients will receive their funds once they have graduated from high school and have proof of enrollment to their post-secondary institution. Checks will be mailed to the institution that you are enrolled in.
